Camp Rules and Info

1. Dogs must be contained while in camp, NO dogs allowed at meals or ride meetings. (ride management may be exempt from this rule)
2. Camp is a dry field and can get quite dusty. We will have straw available for you to take to your camping area and at the rental corrals.
3. **ABSOLUTELY NO CREWING ON THE MOUNTAIN DURING THE EVENT.** Unauthorized crewing will result in disqualification of the rider.
4. Please scatter manure and hay. If you have parked on a gravel RV area, manure must be removed from this area. A dump truck will be on the grounds, please use this for garbage and manure.
5. Showers are available at Juniper Mt Campground (west of camp 1 mile) for \$5/vehicle plus \$3/stinky body. Or at Durfee Hotsprings (2 miles north on the highway) for \$6 , outdoor shower plus cool, warm and hot pools, open Tuesday 6-10 and Friday/ Saturday 4-10.
6. Horse and people water is available in camp, and also at the City of Rocks Visitor Center ½ mile north of camp. We will keep camp tanks filled, please let us know if the tanks in your area need filling and we'll do our best to get there right away with water.
7. Groceries, beer/wine and sundries available at Tracy General Store (closed Sunday) and Rock City (closed Tuesday). Both less than 1 mile north of town. Lodging at Almo Creek Inn 1 mile north of town. Call 208.824.5577 or www.almocreek.com for rates and availability.
8. Nearest airports: Pocatello (PIH) 2 hrs, Boise (BOI) 3 ½ hrs, Salt Lake City (SLC) 2 ½ hrs.
9. Cell service is available in camp, but limited in other areas. Wifi is available at Tracy General Store and Almo Inn (1 mile north of camp) and at Juniper Mt Campground.
10. No electric hookup, but there is electricity to charge phones, batteries, etc at camp office area.
11. It can get very cold during the night, and maybe hot during the day - be prepared for any type of weather. Rain is unlikely, but possible, and if it does rain it will probably be quite cold.
12. This is high altitude country - basecamp at 5400' and you will ride as high as 8500' . Please take this into consideration if you are from low altitude country. The air is thinner.

Directions to Camp:

From Boise (west) take I-84 to exit 216 (Declo); go south on Idaho 77 to Conner Creek Junction, then southwest on the Elba-Almo Road. Drive through Almo and past the City of Rocks Visitor Center. Basecamp will be on the right about 1 mile south of Almo.

From Pocatello and Idaho Falls (north/east), take I-86 and I-84 to exit 216 and proceed as above.

From Salt Lake City (east) take I-84 to exit 245 (Sublett/Malta) then head west toward Malta. Turn left (south) onto highway 81 for .2 miles to Highway 77, then turn right (west). At Connor Creek Junction, follow directions above toward Almo.

Liability Release MUST BE SIGNED BY ALL RIDE ENTRANTS

I wish to enter and participate in the Vettec AERC National Championship Ride, to be held on September 20 and September 22 ,2013 in Almo, Idaho. I have read the rules, conditions, and regulations of the event and will comply with them. As a participant in this event, I agree to abide by the rules the American Endurance Ride Conference (AERC), and the aforementioned ride.

I hereby knowingly execute this waiver of the right to sue and do hereby agree to assume all risks associated with participation in the ride, or in riding on the premises.

I agree that my participation in the ride involves certain inherent risks, which include, but are not limited to, the following:

(1) Horseback riding involves being in remote areas for extended periods of time, far from communications, transportation, and medical facilities; that these areas can have many natural and man-made hazards which ride management cannot anticipate, identify, modify or eliminate, these hazardous surface/subsurface conditions including such things as rocks, trees, puddles, streams, fences, jumps and/or other hard objects and/or holes, divots, ledges which could cause an equine to trip and/or fall and/or could strike a participant who falls from or is thrown from an equine;

(2) that horses can behave in unpredictable ways which can result in accidents to anyone at any time, resulting in injury, severe injury, or death;

(3) that an equine's reactions to sound, movements, objects, vehicles, persons, animals, scents or insects cannot be predicted.

I agree to take full responsibility for myself/my child, and the animal I/my child is riding.

I will hold harmless the AERC, its officers and all individual members thereof, all ride personnel, and all property owners over whose land the ride crosses, their representatives, successors and assigns, for any accident, injury or loss that might occur due to my participation in this ride, and free from all liability for such injury or loss, including that due to negligence not caused by wanton or willful misconduct of ride personnel. This release extends to all claims of every kind and nature whatsoever, whether known or unknown, and I expressly waive any benefits that I may otherwise have under provisions of the law of Idaho relating to the release of known claims.

I understand that this release constitutes a limitation on my legal rights.

I hereby certify that my horse is not under the influence of medication and will not be treated with or given any medications prohibited by AERC rules. I also hereby give permission to AERC or its duly appointed agent to take any appropriate action deemed necessary to check for possible administration of drugs to my horse.

The undersigned verifies acceptance of risks and responsibilities for rider's and horses' conditions and certifies that all information on this form is correct to the best of his/her knowledge.

THIS AGREEMENT IS BINDING UPON MYSELF, MY SPOUSE, LEGAL REPRESENTATIVES, HEIRS, EXECUTORS AND ASSIGNS.
