## How to Do an FEI Ride in 2003 in the United States (For US Citizens Only)

The following is an outline to guide riders through doing an FEI ride in 2003. Please refer to your zone's criteria for the Pan American Championship Criteria. This will include a description of the Certificate of Capability requirements.

#### **RULES**

- It is the responsibility of the competitor to be familiar with the rules under which a ride is held, and to have access to them for reference if needed. Rules can be interpreted in many ways and often need clarification. Please contact USA Equestrian if you ever have any questions about how a rule may be enforced at a ride.
- For the international part of a ride, the FEI's rules and requirements supersede those of any other organization. Note that the FEI Rules for Endurance Riding are not the only rules which apply to an FEI ride. There are many rules that apply to ALL disciplines and these are found in the FEI General Regulations and Veterinary Regulations. The rules for the discipline must be read in conjunction with these other regulations. The FEI Rule Books may be ordered from USA Equestrian or can be viewed on the FEI's website at <a href="https://www.horsesport.org">www.horsesport.org</a>.

#### **HORSES**

- 1. Passports for US horses competing at FEI rides in the US have been waived for 2003.
- 2. Recovery is required within 30 minutes of completion for CEIs\*\*\* and CEIs\*\*\*. Recovery is required within 20 minutes of completion for CEIs\*\* and CEIs\*.
- 3. Horses must be at least 6 years old for CEIs and at least 7 years old for Championships.
- Documentation of equine influenza vaccination is required for all FEI horses. A form is attached to assist riders in maintaining the documentation. Please refer to the following memo for details regarding previous vaccinations.
- 5. Horses must be recorded with USA Equestrian (either life or annual). A lifetime recording is \$200 and an annual recording is \$75. The Horse ID number that has no charge associated with it is not an acceptable form of recording. The forms may be completed and submitted online at <a href="https://www.equestrian.org">www.equestrian.org</a> or by calling USA Equestrian at 859-258-2472 and ask for the Horse Recording Representative.
- 6. Horses must be identifiable by diagram. A Coggins diagram, thoroughly detailing markings, scars, whorls, etc. may be used. The enclosed Horse Description form may also be used if completed and signed by a veterinarian.

#### **RIDERS**

- 1. FEI riders must be active Senior or Junior USA Equestrian members.
- 2. Riders must weigh a minimum of 75 kg (165 pounds) and maintain this weight throughout the ride. The weight requirement is made up of the saddle, saddle blankets, empty water bottles, empty saddlebags, and rider. The bridle and contents of the saddlebag are not included. Weights may be used to meet the minimum requirement. For the Pan American Championship ride the weight requirement is 75kg.
- 3. Whips and spurs are prohibited.
- 4. Safety helmets, and shoes with heels or safety stirrups, are required.
- 5. Other guidelines for dress are detailed in the FEI Rules for Endurance, Art. 817.2.
- 6. To compete at a CEI in a foreign country (even Canada) you must have permission from your National Federation. Contact Athlete Services in Gladstone at (908) 234-0848.
- 7. Junior riders must be meet the FEI age requirement, and have fulfilled AERC's rules to ride unsponsored (completed 500 miles or more and have a letter of parental consent on file at AERC). Juniors must obtain written permission from the Federation by faxing or mailing a letter of the request and a copy of AERC's permission letter to: USA Equestrian Director of Endurance / fax 859 231-6662 / Kentucky Office.

#### FEI EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION REQUIREMENT

Please read in its entirety.

Mandatory for all horses competing in FEI events, even if an FEI passport is not required (exception: horses shipping from Australia and New Zealand, where equine influenza does not exist)

All FEI horses must have documentation, endorsed by a veterinarian, of an initial series of two intramuscular injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza given no less than 21 days and no more than 92 days apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given at least within every 12 months following the 2<sup>nd</sup> shot of the initial series, and more frequently if specified by the manufacturer (for example, intranasal vaccines must be given more frequently to remain effective). **An intranasal vaccination is permissible for the boosters only.** Horses vaccinated intranasally must still have documentation of the initial series according to the above guidelines.

<u>NOTE</u>: Influenza vaccinations may not be administered within 7 days of an FEI competition or within 7 days of entry onto FEI competition grounds.

The vaccination history must be signed and stamped by a licensed veterinarian certifying that the horse's vaccination status is in accordance with the FEI Veterinary Regulations, Annex VI (summarized above). To keep documentation consistent with that required in passports, the veterinarian should record the names and batch numbers of the vaccines. **BE SURE AND HAVE THE VETERINARIAN RECORD ALL BATCH NUMBERS FOR VACCINATIONS GIVEN IN 2003.** Documentation of vaccination for diseases other than equine influenza is not required. A copy of the FEI Passport page is included in this packet and can be used for accurate recording.

If there is a lapse in documentation, for example, a late booster or no record of the initial series, the horse must be re-administered the initial series and any subsequent boosters in order to be in compliance with the rule.

The FEI's vaccination requirement stems from the need to demonstrate to global veterinary authorities that international competition horses are at low risk for the transmission of disease. This status as a low-risk group helps facilitate the movement of competition horses across international borders.

While enforcement of this rule is subject to the discretion of the event officials, the FEI's recommendation is that competitors not in compliance be warned and given instructions to come into compliance prior to their next event. Keep in mind that vaccination deficiencies in passports are treated seriously and persons responsible for passported horses are routinely fined for such violations. It is within the authority of the officials to also impose fines for non-passported horses in violation of the rule.

Competitors who cannot come into compliance prior to their first event should bring the documentation they do have, and should contact the competition management and/or FEI Veterinary Delegate prior to the event. Horses not in compliance must be stabled separately from the others and must not share the same water source. Because of the problems this can create, it is within the authority of the organizing committee or officials to deny entry to horses not in compliance. Organizers may also require proof of vaccination with entries in order to avoid problems at the event. All FEI horses also must be:

- 1) Registered with their National Federations (for US horses, this means recorded with USA Equestrian, either life or annual).
- 2) Identifiable by diagram, such as a <u>thorough</u> Coggins diagram or Horse Description Form indicating detailed markings, whorls, scars, etc. Please let your vet know that the diagram is to be used for identification purposes at events.

#### CRITERIA FOR THE 2003 FEI PAN AMERICAN ENDURANCE RIDE

The complete selection criteria will be available the week of January 19<sup>th</sup> from the zone selection chairs. Please be sure to review these thoroughly.

## CERTIFICATE OF CAPABILITY REQUIREMENTS

All horses and riders wishing to compete in the 2003 FEI Pan American Endurance Championships must meet the criteria for obtaining an FEI "Certificate of Capability." (Please note: an actual certificate is not issued.) In order to earn a Certificate of Capability, both the horse and rider (not necessarily as a combination) must have completed at least **ONE** of the following within 24 months of the closing date for the nominated entries of the event:

\*1. A CEI\*\*\*\* of the same distance as the Championship (no requirements other than completion.)

OR

2. A CEI\*\*\* in one day or over 2 days at a minimum speed of 12 kph

OR

3. Finished in the top 50% of finishers at a CEI\*\*\*

OR


4. Finished within 140% of the winning time at a CEI\*\*\*

\*Please Note for Qualification #1: The only ride in this country that satisfies the standard within the 24 month time frame is the 2001 Pan American Championship.

#### ANSWERS TO FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

- 1. If I completed an AERC sanctioned ride taking place in conjunction with an FEI ride can I use that ride as a qualifier?
  - You must be entered in the FEI section of the ride in order to use the ride to fulfill the certificate requirements. For qualifications three and four as listed above, the percentages are based only on those riders entered in the FEI section of the ride.
- 2. When do I have to complete the requirements for the certificate? You must complete the requirements for the certificate of capability no later than 4 weeks from the date nominated entries are due. For PAC 2003 this will be approximately August 15<sup>th</sup>.
- 3. What rides are CEI\*\*\*\* with no speed requirement necessary? *The only ride in this country that is a CEI*\*\*\*\* *is the PAC 2001.*
