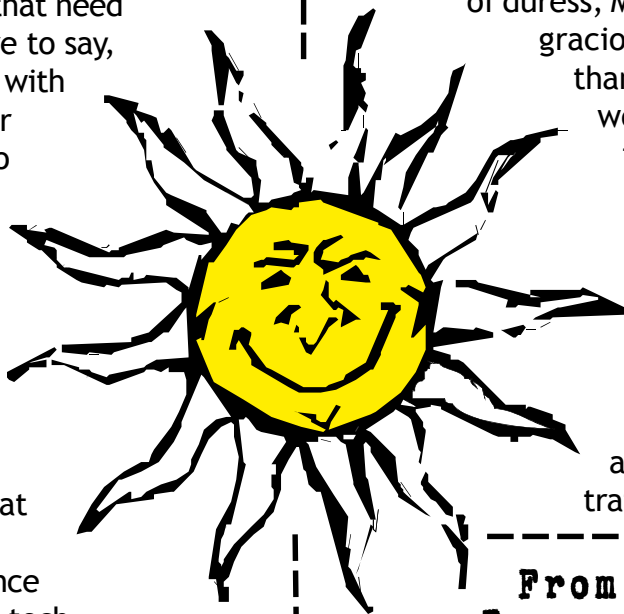

MY FIRST VICTORY!

Sometime in the summer of 1993, shortly after this crazy guy arrived in Redmond Oregon, I was introduced to Linda and Dennis Tribby, successful endurance riders. Well, Dennis had already a national title, he garnished in 1988, if I am not mistaking, the heavyweight National Champion title. They encouraged me to visit them on their property to try out a training ride with my horse Eccho. He is a 14.2 hand Arabian gelding which at 16 was in excellent shape and I had no



hesitation to take them up on the offer. A couple of weeks later my farrier and his wife were heading up to the Ochocos to start this introduction for me of the sport called distance riding. Remember I am European, so I am allowed to use the expressions I read in British magazines. I was still in my Cowboy years. My dress code--very John Wayne, meaning cowboy boots, spurs and 5 gallon hat, don't forget a western saddle. Needless to say, after the first half hour of posting, trotting for miles with no rest, my ass started to feel the abuse the jeans were giving my tender parts of my body. Now Eccho, he really enjoyed it. When we finally made a stop to water the horses, everybody except me pulled a stethoscope out of somewhere and checked their mounts heart rates. As I understood, they waited till the pulses dropped to 60 BPM. I asked Dennis to check my horse. Then Dennis called his wife over to double check and asked her the numbers. "44" she said. They were surprised by the result and assured me that my little horse had it in him. A weekend later I was invited again, but Linda asked me if I would like to ride one young horse of theirs. Sure I was excited and accepted the offer. TIO MUNDO was a dream to look at and one of the smoothest horse flesh I ever sat on. At 4 years of his age, he had energy for two, but everything easy to control. I rode him on a 20 mile conditioning ride on the Bandit Springs ride loop. Dennis wanted me to ride him on a race over 21 or 24 mile ride in Millican. Did I look forward to this ride? Yes, I guess I was like a child in anticipation to Christmas.

The day before the ride I learned how to prepare camp. I watched closely how everything was handled, feeding, grain, check-in by the vet, and I gazed at all those riders who came as far as from Canada and California. A lot of riders I've heard about it before, I started right away reading magazines covering endurance riding, so I was aware of most of what each other had done in these events. We gathered in George's barn, where he held his ride meeting. I heard about rules, etiquettes and stuff the vet was explaining. I have to admit, all I was listening to was what I had to do on my 24 miles. I understood there was one vet check on Pine Mountain near the observatorium with a 15 minute hold. "You are not done with the ride till your horse reaches a pulse of 64." To win is to finish! This is straight from the AERC bible. Before I went to sleep Dennis had a last pep talk with me. He told me to follow Raimy Strout, just stick with him, if you hang with him you be OK. There was not much sleep that night, was it the accommodation? I don't think so.



Two and a half hours before the start I fed TIO his ration of grain and hay. Tio looked fabulous, black was his registered color. He held his head proud like an Arabian should. Big eyes were prominent and sharp. I knew that he will teach me something today and I was willing to read him well. All I had to do was follow what I had learned so far from my friends, the Tribbys. Sure I was a decent horseman by then. In 1992 I won the Californian Horsemanship Award on Eccho in English and Western-riding combined. I had started young horses already by then, but this was a different situation all over. The two hours before mount-up I watched some hundred milers coming in for their first vet

check. I got an eyeful of vet check action right there. Standing with the other riders the last two minutes and waiting for the signal to take off, I could feel the adrenolin steering my blood and my heart to areas only known to me at my ski racing times many, many moons prior to this.

And we where off! Raemy was ahead of me. After a hundred yards or so, TIO with no warning made a 180, I was lucky to stay on. We resumed in a trot and in no time reached Mr. Strout. We took his pace for a while, but Tio decided it wasn't the right speed and went in front. There was nobody ahead of us. Checking back over my shoulders I had only Raemy following me. After about 3 miles the road started to get steeper and we slowed the pace slightly. Raemy and I hold a conversation about Europe and skiing, all that bla-bla-stuff to pass the time. Before the last very steep assault to the vet check I asked this knowledgeable rider how he would rate my beautiful steed. "If you ride him like this to the finish line, you will have trash, to me he looks too soft" Now this was hard to swallow. I put in my mind to show and prove him wrong! It started at the vet check. Tio pulsed down one minute ahead of his mount. A mile down the trail I

waited for the pair which surprised him some. For the next 7 or 8 miles it went downhill on a rocky kind of road. Til we reached the valley bottom, we mostly walked or jogged our horses. It resulted in the up coming of another rider to join us. I thought third place, I should be happy with. Our trio had about three and a half miles left to go. After a while I realized nobody was following me close anymore. At the sight of the finish line a couple of 100 yards behind me Raemy and the other rider dismounted and walked the rest of the way. Me, I rode in to the checkpoint. George took my horses pulse and announced before Raemy came in, number 3, down. I didn't took in at that moment that actually I had won the LD ride. Raemy congratulated me and my horse. I thanked him for letting this rookie win. He just stared at me and smiled. A few rides later he admitted that he didn't let me win, that he hoped my horse wouldn't pulse down in time. My first ride! My first win! They created a monster! I will be forever thankful to my good and dear friends Linda and Denny Tribby.

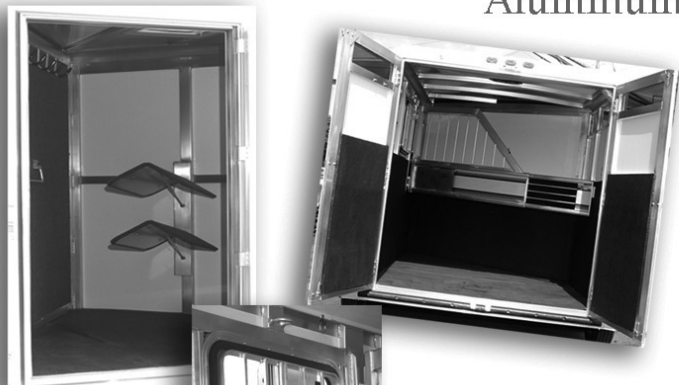

Murphy's Law

Story #1: I never tie horses in my trailer, just because I always have the thought - way in the back of my mind, since it has never happened to me - that a horse might fall in the trailer and then hang from the tied rope. But recently, I had driven about 5 miles and had about 2 miles to go to get to where I ride, when I felt the trailer lurch and then heard noises from the trailer that didn't sound right. So I stopped immediately and ran back to the trailer to see if all was OK (you know how the horses are usually standing there with that look that says "Why did you stop? Nothing's going on back here." Looking through the window, I saw my mare, Sophie, lying on the floor. I very quickly opened the then opened the divider so that if she did stand up, she wouldn't hit her back on the divider. Then I went back to open the drop door and that's when I heard this awful wheezing sound, like she was strangling. Somehow, when she fell (I still don't know why she fell), she caught both of her jaw bones on the edge of the feedbag. The feedbags are strong, and are reinforced along the top edge with a strip of webbing. Her weight made it impossible to unsnap the feed bag clips and I didn't have a knife with me to cut the bag. I ended up lifting her head slightly by pulling on the halter and then pulling the bag off of each jaw bone and slowly lowering her head. She started breathing normally almost immediately. I learned two lessons. Always carry a knife! And if your feedbags attach the way mine do, modify them. I made loops out of heavy cotton string and tied them to the metal loops in the trailer. And if I use feed bags at all now, I clip into the string loops instead of the metal. I'm hoping they would work like the leather loop on a breakaway halter and break when there's enough weight on them. I just hope I never have to find out.



Story #2: One the way to a ride a few years ago, I felt the trailer lurch one time and just kept on going to the ride. When I got to the ride (3 hours later) and took my horse out of the trailer, he had a water-filled swelling on his chest. Mike Foss checked him out for me and suggested that he might have gotten stung by a bee. So I looked in the back of my trailer and after a while found a small wasp nest in one of the vents on the ceiling. I felt so awful, knowing that Kaz got stung and then had to stand there, trapped in the trailer, for 3 more hours. I've always wondered why our horses so willingly (most of them anyway) walk into a trailer. Now I always do a scan of the back of the trailer for wasps or wasp nests before I put a horse in there.



Watch Your Manners!

Warning!! They're behind you and moving fast. They're not slowing down, not giving you any warning and don't seem to care how your horse is reacting to their approach.

Safety on the trail is something that should concern all of us. Unfortunately there are a few riders who either don't know about it or don't care. We encountered two of those recently, who, without warning, cantered down the trail scattering horses and riders. My horse barely got out of their way in time as did the horse next to me. The riders went right between us and cantered on even after I informed them that they had almost caused a wreck. Yes, they heard me, one of them answered but they just kept going. Later I talked with other riders who had been blown off the trail by them without warning. Thankfully I believe everybody came out of this situation ok.

Did they think they were in a demolition derby?

It would seem like common courtesy to warn people and their horses that you are behind them and want to pass. Slow down, wait for the rider to get out of your way or pass beside them if there is room. Say "thank you". Remember, you learned that in kindergarten.

Watering places are another place where horses in close proximity can get into trouble. When approaching a watering place wait your turn. Don't come running up on horses that are there already drinking or being sponged. Leave slowly if there are still horses getting a drink. If a rider is on the ground, it is a good idea to be sure that they'll be ok if you leave before they get back on their horse.


Gates can be real bottlenecks and problem areas. Give everybody plenty of room. Wait for the person who opened the gate to get back on their horse and in the place they were in line before you leave. After all, they were nice enough to open the gate for you. Be a good sport, you can pass them later.

Look for those red flags in horse's tails. It says "Warning, I might kick" so believe it! I am just amazed at how many people don't even notice a ribbon in a horse's tail. It should be the first thing you look for when approaching a horse from the rear. Look for them in the pulse down area and the vet check too. Keep in mind that horses without ribbons also kick sometimes if they feel threatened.

Be aware of what is going on around you. Your horse might tolerate having water thrown on him, or a blanket, but that green horse next to you might blow up and hurt somebody. Usually horses don't want to share their hay and say so forcefully to a hungry horse that just can't wait for his own flake of hay. People and horses do get hurt at these events, but we can prevent a lot of it by being careful and keeping in mind what could happen.

One of the things I like about endurance riding is that the riders take care of each other. Usually.

75 – 50 – 25 – 15

LOCATION: Old Nile Sawmill Site—from Yakima, take Highway 12 west thru Naches. At the junction of Hwy 12 and 410, take 410 right to Nile Road. Left on Nile Road to Forest Service Road 1600 (about 3.5 miles). Left on FS Road 1600 about 3.3 miles to Forest Service Road 1601. Left on 1601 to camp in meadow.

TRAIL: Jeep roads, old skid roads, cross country trails thru timber and across ridge tops. Excellent footing, very little rock. Elevation changes from camp at about 2000 feet to over 5400 feet at Clover Springs, with about 1500 foot elevation changes on the other loops. Two out vet checks for the 75's and 50's on the 50 mile loop; one out vet check for the 25's. Plenty of horse water in camp and on the trail; bring own people water.

FEES: 75—\$85 50—\$70 25—\$60 15—\$25. \$10 Junior discount except on the 15 miler. Non AERC members—\$10. We will refund all but \$10 if you pre-register and cannot attend. Canadian Riders may enter at par.

TIMES: Begin pre-ride vetting at 3 PM Friday. Ride meeting after 8:30 PM. 75's start at 5 AM; 50's at 6 AM; 25's at 7 AM; 15's at 8 AM.

GENERAL: All AERC and PNER Rules apply. Horses must be shod. Proof of registration needed for breed awards. Completion, First Place, Top 10, Tail-ender, and B.C. Awards—completion only for the 15 miler.

DINNER: We will again host our famous salmon (if available) and rib BBQ for all riders. Crews and family members can purchase dinner tickets for \$5 at registration. If you wish, bring a dessert to share.

AWARDS: Sunday morning at 7 AM, so plan on staying.

My horse was too nervous to drink, but he splashed around a little just to make me happy. It was a bit overwhelming as I stood in line for the vet and did whatever I had to do in thirty minutes. It was

surprising how fast the time went by. Before I knew it, I was out on the trail again, flying past hilltops and sagebrush and juniper trees. Soon I was in camp again, showing for B.C. I weighed in at 203 Lbs.! Can you believe it?

At the rainy awards ceremony, I won Best Condition and First Junior In. It turns out I was right—I did have quite a story to tell in the end.
