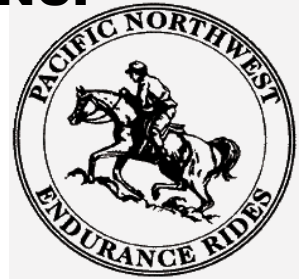
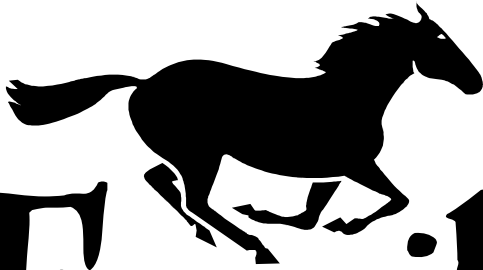

From the President's Paddock...

I haven't been riding much lately, as I've been suffering from AEHS, otherwise known as Aging Endurance Horse Syndrome. We've got two 20 year olds at home, both of which have had long careers spanning well over 10 years. They still look about half their age, but as endurance horses, we all know that hitting the big "2 0" often means competition days are numbered. It also means we become a bit hypersensitive to every little hiccup on the trail. What would be an insignificant trip performed by an 8-year-old, becomes worthy of a full-on investigation when performed by a 20 something. On the other hand, to see them happily moving out loosely after a 50 miler (or more) provides such delight and affirmation that it's hard to know when it's time to quit. It's also tough not to let your own goals blur your vision. For me, it's been a slow process of watching and waiting, and wondering. After starting the last two seasons with great hopes, a very willing steed, and a couple of good completions, we've had a couple of "hiccups" that have now turned every ride into a scientific analysis. The not knowing really sucks. It makes it really difficult to plan out a ride schedule, and themes and potlucks. Sure, I've had vet consultations - I really like the last one. While looking at x-rays the vet says, "Well, I don't really see anything here that I wouldn't expect to see on a 20 year old endurance horse" Great. I take that as a license to continue and just about jump for joy! Is that sick or what? The vet does recommend a course of action for overall

joint support that isn't exactly cheap, (of course) and hasn't Peek earned it after 3,000 plus endurance miles? How can I deny him? I'll just have to cut back somewhere else. Well, I haven't been to many rides this year, so I guess we've already saved there, just not sure where it went. But since the point is to start going to rides again, that's obviously not a long-term solution. Maybe I'll have to give up on the organic foods and go back to eating chemicals. It's cheaper. But I can't help thinking that if this doesn't work; I've got to find something else for him to do. I don't mind cutting back on my distances, for now, but that's only going to last so long and Lord knows he's probably got another 15 years in him. Will I be relegated to the neighborhood riding club where the people spend more time talking and drinking and eating than they ever spend in the saddle? Yikes. The thought is a bit depressing. And BTW, I've been a little surprised to realize how much my emotional well being is tied to my horse's soundness. That wasn't in the Endurance 101 memo! (But I'm sure many of you have experienced this). I realize most people that get to this point just start another youngster, but having this long a relationship with one horse, not to mention limited space and income, it's just not an easy decision for me. Well, I guess I'm just on that steep gravel road at mid-afternoon, wondering what the Heck I'm doing out here. In the past, the answer has always come as long as I endured and listened to my horse. Hopefully that will be the case once again. But Geez, I wish he could talk!Take Care, Julie Barnfather

From the VP Corral...

As I sit down to write this column, I am thinking of the folks who recently had a mishap at a ride and lost their horses. I hope that by the time this reaches you, both horses will have been found and reunited with their owners. I lost my horse at a ride years ago; thankfully, we found him early the next morning, with three neat slices across his knees, chest, and eyes from crashing through a barbed wire fence—but amazingly, no permanent damage. But I feel deeply for anyone who loses their horses—it is just a gut-wrenching experience you wouldn't wish on anyone.

There's lots of talk on the listserv about how unfortunate event happened. It doesn't sound like anything except plain bad luck. In these cases, it's worthwhile remembering that there are indeed risks associated with this sport—and that if we choose to participate, we accept these risks. In the case of the notorious bees at this ride, it

seems that ride management put out a near-heroic effort to manage the bee population—but it's simply impossible to wipe out every single yellow jacket out of a forest.

So what's the solution? Stop riding? Don't go to rides where there might be bees? I sure hope not. We take considerable risks with our horses every day—putting them in trailers, riding on new trails, riding rank or green horses—and most of the time, with a little common sense, we do ok. But sometimes, rarely, the proverbial excrement occurs. At these times, it's worth taking a deep breath, remembering why we do this, and remembering that the odds are generally in our favor, and these incidents, although tragic, are blessedly rare.

So let's keep riding, let's keep supporting these wonderful rides, and trust that if we take care of our horses, in most cases, they'll take care of us. And my good wishes to the folks whose horses went missing—I know the entire endurance community is hoping for the best.

Junior Riders BC Rebuttals....

MY 2 CENTS....

I don't mean to be difficult, but I feel I must respond to discrepancies in the letter that was in the Aug. PNER Family News about the issue of some rides not awarding a Jr. BC.

The specific comments I take issue with; "All it means is that a Jr. BC must be determined." and "....there is a rule that says that there will be a Jr. BC awarded."

I have sponsored a few Jr.'s in my time, and think they should be encouraged, most assuredly but not at the cost of a horse or horsemanship.

There are only 4 PNER rules in the year-book/handbook, none of which address Jr. BC Under the heading PNER Awards, there is an explanation of the Jr. BC award, HOWEVER this is NOT a "rule", only an explanation of the requirements necessary to EARN this award.

The 1st PNER rule says: ALL AERC rules apply to all PNER rides.... So now, let's look at what AERC says about Jr. BC awards. NOTHING. In the 2006 AERC rule book info about Jr. riders is on page 19 & 20 - rules 10 thru 10.6 - no mention of Jr. BC.

So now, let's look at what it takes to EARN any BC award. Page 10 & 11 - rules 9 thru 9.4.2.1 I will quote the rule that pertains to Jr. BC.

9 - An award will be available for the equine judged to be in the Best Condition.

9.1 - The award does not have to be given.

9.1.1 - the vet may feel that none of the equines in the contention for the award deserve to receive it.

If PNER says a Jr. BC MUST be given, then what would we be teaching our kids? maybe, that it is OK to run your horse into the ground because you might get a BC as long as the other Jr. horses

look worse than your own. At the Pacific Crest Ride this year, at the awards meeting, the vet said that she felt no Jr. horse qualified to be judged for BC.

I have been to a few rides where NO BC was awarded to anyone. Should a Jr. PNER rider get more privileges than a Senior rider.

9.2.2 - Rides have the option of giving other BC besides the AERC BC if they wish.

This rule says management has the OPTION to give other BC awards, besides just the one AERC BC. So it leaves the door open for a Jr. BC award.

9.3.1 - The ride vet will be sole judge of the vet portion of the award.

So if the vet at my ride refuses to judge a horse for Jr. BC, regardless of the reason, should the vet portion of the BC form be dropped/or who should judge it?

I ask, if you are going to quote, explain or clarify a rule, or anything else, please check and make sure your statements are accurate. I feel this issue has brought some good questions to light and need to be cleared up so ride managers understand their options better.

By trying to force ride management to give an award that may not have been earned, what message are we sending to our up and coming young riders???

I hope this letter is taken in the spirit intended, not as an attack but instead as an eye opener to "the rest of the story."

Hi Carol-

Hey thanks for giving another view. In response to your comments I'd like to say that in last month's letter, I did say that the Junior rider must have a "...horse that meets the minimum vet criteria" If, at the Pacific Crest Ride you're trying to say that none of the horses did, I'd ask why the vet judged the horses and wrote down the marks on the cards an hour after the completion exam? And why didn't the vet tell all the riders or their parents that their horses did not qualify to be judged, even though they were judged? One rider was even told while she was being judged that she "rode too slow" to get Junior BC. One of the other riders is still unaware of the vet's reason for not feeling that the horse did not qualify to be judged. Once again, I come back to being pulled after a ride, and not being told about it....preposterous.... similar to judging for BC and not having the vet announce the Junior BC winner.

I'd like to point out that my letter in last month's newsletter was not aimed at a single event. All rides need to announce a Junior BC winner.

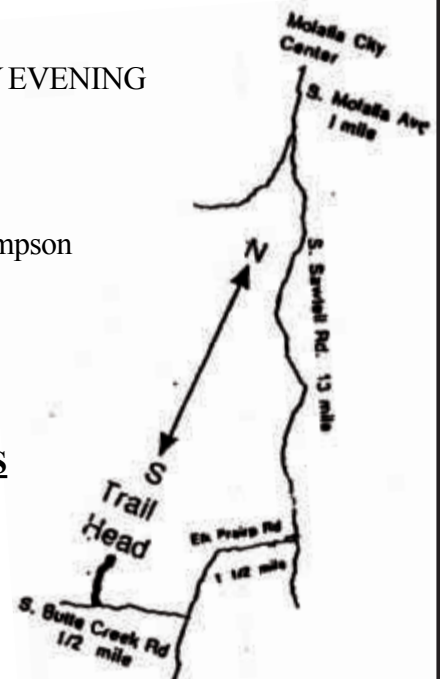

PNER Riders At The Tevis Cup: 2006 Report

Six PNER riders entered the 2006 Western States 100-Mile Ride, nicknamed the Tevis Cup after the trophy given to the 1st place rider. A seventh rider from the Pacific Northwest was also entered. Overall there were 205 riders entered in Tevis, with 196 of them starting the ride at 5:15 am Saturday, August 5, above Lake Tahoe, at the Robie Equestrian Park, elevation 7,280 ft going down into Squaw Valley up and over Immigrant Pass, elevation 8,700 ft. Despite below average temperatures, only 87 of these riders would cross the finish line within 24 hours "fit to continue", a 100-miles later at McCann Stadium in Auburn, California, elevation 1,200 ft.

The six PNER riders were:

- Karen Bish (OR) #40,
- Ona Lawrence (OR) #17,
- Dean Hoalst (WA) #101,
- Tom Noll (ID) # 140,
- Laura Yost (ID) # 215, and
- Sue Walz (OR) #198.

The seventh rider from the Pacific Northwest was

- Lisa Benner (WA) #39.

All rode Arabians, except Sue Walz, who rode a Kentucky Mountain Horse.

The 196 riders attempting the 2006 Tevis were from seven countries and 20 states. There were 29 non-Arabian entries, including 4 mules and 2 Missouri Fox Trotters.

Word was that Hal Hall (CA) # 2, Potato Richardson (CA) #14, and Ken Keele (CA) #223 were the riders to watch. This was to be Hal's 26th Tevis completion. Hal had 3 Tevis Cups and 3 Haggan Cups (The best condition award). He has the most completions at Tevis with the exception of Barbara White, Julie Suhr's daughter, with 27 finishes. Hal came in 2nd in 2005.

Potato had 17 Tevis finishes, with one Tevis Cup. He was in

the lead in 2005 at Lower Quarry (mile 94) when his horse, Tycho's Comet, went lame. Ken Keele rode Tycho's Comet this year for a considerable fee. Potato rode his stallion, Garcon. There were several other top ten rider

contenders from last year competing this year. Cathy Rohm Richardson, the Tevis Cup winner of 2005 did not compete.

Of the Pacific Northwest (PNW) riders, Ona, Dean and Sue had completed Tevis once. In 1997, Ona came in 6th and won the Haggan Cup riding Danny McCoy. This year she rode Mu. Sue and Dean both pulled in 2005, but completed in 2004, finishing 22nd and 26th respectively. This year, Dean rode PK Whiskey, who had not been to Tevis. Sue rode Raven, who had completed Tevis twice in three attempts. Karen and Omega, Tom and Frank,

Laura and Noble, and Lisa and Jack would be attempting Tevis for the first time.

A before dawn start, after the moon had gone down, Potato and Ken took the lead early, keeping it for almost 60 miles. Hal was also pulled at Red Star Ridge (mile 28.5). A total of 24 riders were pulled by this point.

Of the PNW riders, Ona and Dean were among the first group to leave Robie Park. Karen, Sue and Laura started in the second group. Sue overcame about 40 riders, including Dean and Ona to get near top 20 by Red Star Ridge (mile 28.5), flirting with the top 20 for most of the rest of the day.

Tom was the only PNW rider to start in the third group at the back of the pack. He resisted the impulse to race, even with his overtime at Big Horn 100 three weeks ago, spending the entire day toward the back of the pack taking care of Frank. The only times he was ahead of other PNW riders was when those riders got too close to the cut-off times.

Karen began to show signs of dehydration at the first one-hour hold at Robinson Flat (mile 36) at 10:30 am. The crew support and hour rest helped, but she slowed down considerably in the heat of the day through the two steep

canyon drops and climbs, getting into Foresthill (mile 68.5), only 13 minutes before the 8:30 pm cut-off. Lisa cut it even closer arriving at Foresthill with merely 2 minutes before the 8:30 pm cut-off. Tom made it into Foresthill comfortably by 7:34 pm, with Laura about ten minutes behind him.

Kassandra DiMaggio (CA) #10 (10th in Tevis 05) was the first rider into Foresthill at 4:21 pm, followed by Michel Bloch (CA) #42, almost 20 minutes later. Michel had been top 10 in 2005 riding into Deadwood (mile 56) when his horse, Monsieur Joseph, was pulled on a metabolic.

Potato arrived at Foresthill (mile 68.5) five minutes behind Michel, with John Crandell (VA) #54 arriving a mere minute later. John won the 2006 Old Dominion 100 in Virginia riding his father's horse, Star Tanny. He was in the middle of the pack coming into Red Star, but made up a lot of spaces in the last 41 miles. Ken Keele never got to Foresthill. He was pulled at Michigan Bluff (mile 62.5).

Sue arrived at Foresthill in 17th places at 6:12 pm, with Ona and Dean about 20 minutes behind her. Seven horses were pulled at Foresthill including two of the mules, making the overall total of pulled at 96 horses pulled, including the two Missouri Foxtrotters. None of the pulls were PNW horses. Before the end of the ride, 13 more horses would be pulled.

"The race starts here," Cathy Rohm Richardson said, as she worked the boards at Foresthill, writing down the arrival times for the public. Foresthill to Auburn is a 32-mile mostly downhill run. At dusk and a bit of dark for a few top riders, all in the dark for the rest, with a three-quarter moon, with the trail mostly in the shade along the American River canyon. A 2500ft drop to Lower Quarry (mile 94), back up a mere 500 ft over 6 miles to the finish line.

Among the top riders, John passed Michel and Potato and rode into Francisco (mile 86) together with Kassandra, 1st and 2nd. As for the PNW riders, Sue rode into Francisco 21st, with Dean and Ona couple of minutes behind. The rest of the PNW riders spread out hours apart, but with still time to finish those last 14 miles.

John caught up with Kassandra before Francisco's and they rode together from there all of the way into Lower Quarry (mile 94) at 9 pm. Kassandra would later make the comment that it was refreshing to cross Poverty Bar River Crossing (mile 89) with enough daylight to see the bottom. John led most of the way, with Kassandra taking the lead and picking up the pace the last couple of miles into Lower Quarry. John pulsed down first and led the way for the last 6 miles. Michel went through Lower Quarry four minutes later with Potato a minute behind him. Potato caught up with Michel in those last 6 miles, but lost time behind John and Kassandra. John crossed the finish line 1st at 10:23 pm, with Kassandra 3 minutes behind him. Potato was 3rd at 11:10 pm with Michel 4th at 11:11 pm.

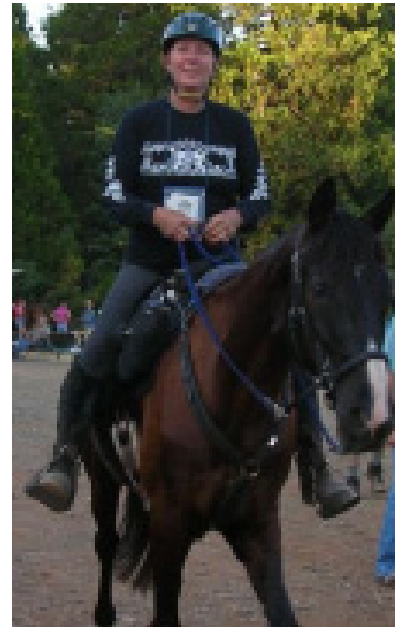
From the high 90's in the middle of the day, the temperature had dropped into the low 70's

with a cool breeze. All that adrenaline of the last couple of days was wearing off in this last stretch from Foresthill (mile 68.5). Sue fell asleep in the saddle. Ona stopped to help another rider in trouble; Dean's horse would not go through a gate for over 2 hours. There was still time to

finish, but the moon was going down. At the last checkpoint at Lower Quarry (mile 94), Laura Yost came in at 12:49 am, Sue at 12:54, Karen and Lisa at 1:32 and Ona 2:18 am. Sue's horse Raven was the first non-Arab to cross the finish line at 2:20 am in 22nd place, before Tom or Dean got to Lower Quarry at 2:57, and 3:14 respectively. Still two hours for Tom and Dean to go 6 miles in the now pitch dark. But

Tom had been taking it easy all day and had plenty of horse, so did Ona and Dean. Tom finished next of the PNW riders at 4:28 followed by Ona at 4:38, Dean at 4:50, Karen and Lisa at 4:52, and lastly Laura Yost at 4:54 am 81st, with 21 minutes to spare. One of the 2 remaining mules was pulled at Lower Quarry (mile 94), leaving only one mule to complete the ride at 4:23 am.

John Crandell was awarded both the Tevis Cup and The Haggen Cup the next day. All the Pacific Northwest riders received their Tevis buckles on that Sunday afternoon. Second buckles for Sue, Ona and Dean, the first buckle for Tom, Karen, Lisa and Laura. Karen was not there to receive her buckle as she was still recovering from dehydration. Congratulations to all. Tevis in '07 or Bust!!!Paul Latiolais

The list goes on so whomever I didn't list, please accept my sincerest thanks!

With 2 hours sleep under his belt Grant got up and cooked Eggs Benny for Sunday morning breakfast to 80 or so hungry riders, crew, vets and volunteers. His special sauce was a hit again - the Eggs Benny Breakfast is now a Rainbow tradition I guess! Best Condition judging for the 100's was held before breakfast with the awards coming after. Made for a very entertaining and special Sunday morning. We had some great donations for a Raffle - Barbara Hart won the Tipparary helmet donated by the Carletons; Stuart and Anne Culver won a Rainbow picnic set donated by Anita Clegg; the Diamond H donation of a "Bacchus Picnic blanket", Swiss army knife and disposable camera was won by ? And we raised \$174 for ERABC International fund from the raffle!

Again, the Americans did us proud - about 12 or 14 came up from the US of A and got a very tacky Canadian flag flashing pin and/or a Canadian tote bag! We love having them here - a truly International flavour to our ride and I know they like coming as many of them are "repeats"!

Anne Mackay and Trish Hoy lent a very colourful corner to ride camp with the "Store". Anne's colourful tie dyed shirts are always a hit. Combined with the Rainbow t's, Trish's Torsion saddles, some used equipment and Dorothy Roscorla's homemade muffins, the store seemed always to be busy. Thanks to all who stepped in to 'person' the store throughout the day.

I'm sure I have forgotten many stories and didn't hear of others - but it was great having everyone come again and to welcoming new people to Ride Over the Rainbow! Set the date aside for the 17th year in 2007 - June 30th...
